- May 2019: Naples Pathways Coalition proposed vision for 70+ mile Paradise Coast Trail
- June 2019: Collier Metropolitan Planning Organization issued resolution of support for PCT
- June 2020: PCT Feasibility Study funding included in state budget following sponsorship by Senator Passidomo through Local Funding Initiative Request #1167

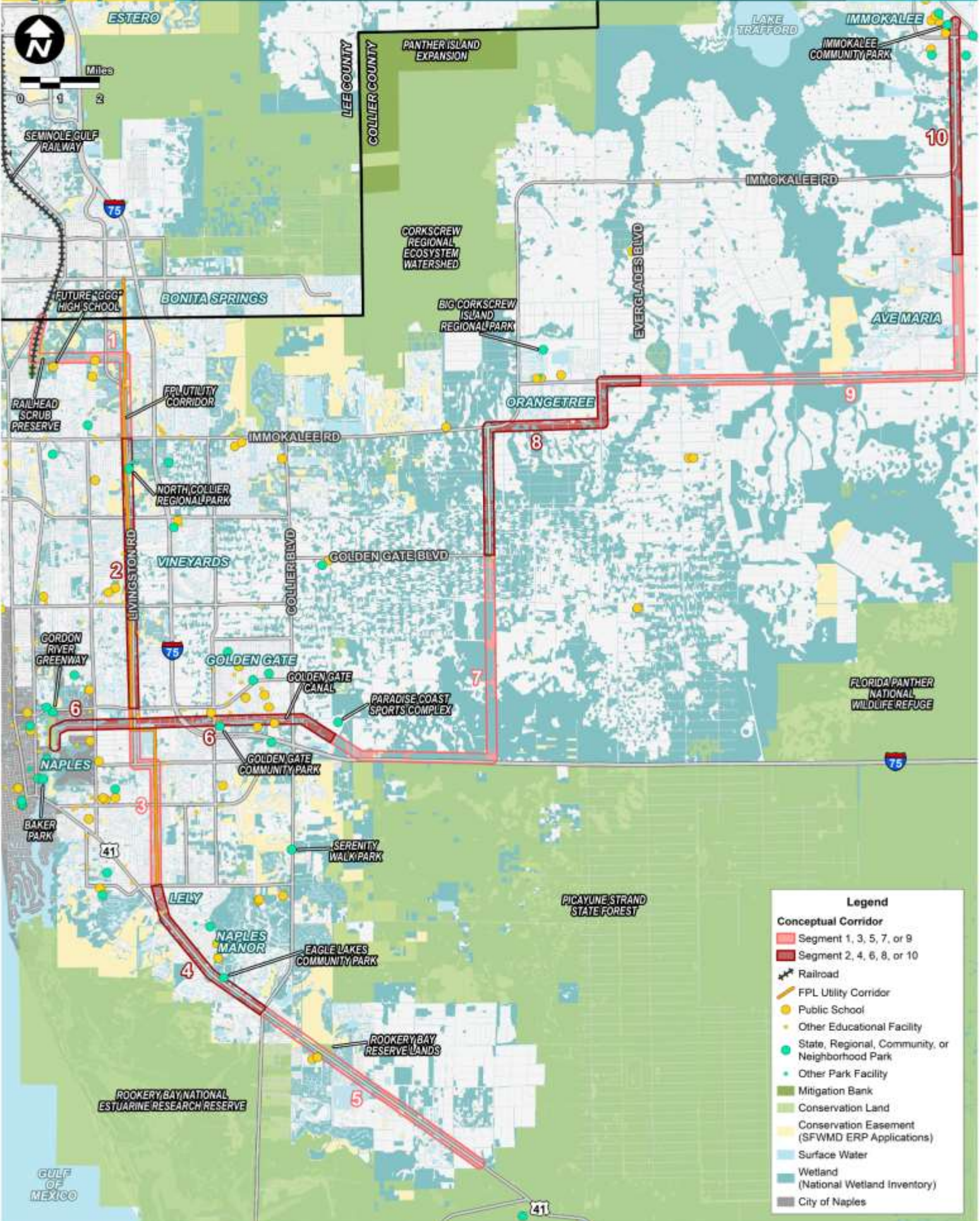

- The PCT Feasibility Study began in April 2021
- The effort launched with extensive outreach to stakeholders representing:
 - Local and State Agencies
 - Business and Tourism
 - Community Foundations
 - Environment and Conservation
 - Parks and Recreation
 - Tribal Nations
 - Healthcare
 - Community Developers
- The Study Team conducted a comprehensive existing conditions survey and is currently analyzing alternative routes for *five major connections*:
 - Planned Lee County Trail to Rich King Memorial Greenway (Segments 1, 2, 3)
 - Rich King Memorial Greenway to Collier-Seminole State Park (Segments 4, 5)
 - Baker Park/Gordon River Greenway to Paradise Coast Sports Complex (Segment 6)
 - Paradise Coast Sports Complex to Ave Maria Town Center (Segments 7, 8, 9)
 - Ave Maria Town Center to Immokalee Community Park (Segment 10)
- The Study Team will be seeking input on proposed PCT alternatives at a Public Open House on January 26, 2022 at River Park Community Center
- Following the Open House, targeted environmental analysis will be conducted on priority segments to get a head start on the next phase of work
- The Final PCT Pathway Report is expected to be completed by May 2022
